




## Eddy Arboretum Interpretive Center


### Program Description:

The Eddy Arboretum Interpretive Center is located at the Institute of Forest Genetics, a field site of the USDA, Forest Service, PSW Research Station, Placerville, CA. The Institute is the first research station in the world devoted to forest genetics research. Since 1925, the Eddy Arboretum documents 75 years of research towards understanding the impact of genetics and genetic diversity on sustainable forest management, healthy ecosystems and the conservation of our natural resources. The Eddy Arboretum has one of the largest pine collections in the world. The existing conservation education program consists of a self-guided tour through the arboretum as well as guided tours by appointment. These visitors encompass elementary through university groups as well as community organizations and international groups. The CE funding would enable us to update the current deteriorated displays with updated displays, which would stand on their own for self-guided drop in visitors but could also be used for guided tours.
