





Percentage of Partnerships Established: (by Organizational Affiliation)



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





Audience Members

A total of 193,826 persons were reached through the conservation education efforts of Region 4. 66,176 (34%) were reached directly, and another 127,650 were reported to be reached indirectly. Of the total audience members reported to be reached 35.5% were identified as being from an urban environment, and 12.5% were considered to be audience members from a traditionally underserved population.
