





## Partnerships


A total of 64 partnerships were created to support the II reported Conservation Education programs and activities.






The II Conservation Education Programs & Activities by Type:



## Audience Members

A total of 27,658 persons were reached through the conservation education efforts of Region 6. 6,733 (24.3%) were reached directly, and another 20,925 were reported to be reached indirectly. Of the total audience members reported to be reached 2.1% were identified as being from an urban environment, and 6.9% were considered to be audience members from a traditionally underserved population.
