Do you want to protect trees? Then, don't move firewood. Moving firewood can spread invasive, tree-killing diseases and insect pests like the Asian longhorned beetle. Already, the Asian longhorned beetle's existence in the U.S. has resulted in the loss of thousands of trees in New Jersey, New York, and Illinois.

Help stop this beetle and save trees. Buy and use your firewood locally. Don't take it with you and don't bring any back.

And remember, officials survey trees for signs of beetle infestation year 'round and may be in your area.
